**General Contest Rules:**

**Current International Judo Federation (IJF) rules will be used with the following modifications:**

- **The Contest Area** shall be 8 x 8 meters with 4 meter safety area between competition areas and 3 meter outside borders.
- **The “CARE System” will not be used.** Three referees will be on the mat.
- **Shime-waza** (Choking Techniques) are only allowed for Shonen and Seinen Divisions (13 years and older). **NO SHIME-WAZA in Adaptive/Special Needs Divisions or Newaza (Mom’s) division.**
- **Kansetsu-waza** (Arm Lock Techniques) are only allowed for Seinen (17 years and older) and only Brown and Black Belt Divisions. If one is entered into this division, one must adhere to the rules of the division. **No KANSETSU-WAZA in Adaptive/Special Needs Divisions or Newaza (Mom’s) division.**
- **No Kanibasami** (Flying Scissors) and no **Kawazu Gake** (Leg Entanglement Throw).
- **Pre 2003 Medical Rules** will be observed in all Divisions except Seinen Brown and Black Belt Divisions. Referee will use the **Current IJF medical rules for Brown/Black division**. Referee can call medic in Yonen and Shonen division at the discretion of the referee and safety of the players and the sport of Judo.
- Any competitor who **suffers a concussion or who loses consciousness** from the head impact will not be permitted to continue competing during this event. Medical staff will evaluate the player and make the medical determination.
- Any **Shonen** competitor who doesn’t submit and is choked out will not be permitted to continue in any further division.
- **Golden Score** in all typical divisions (not Special Needs Divisions). Golden Score is unlimited in time. If any Special Needs Division is tied by positive scores, then Hantei will be given.

**White Judo Gis are Mandatory for all competitors.** Blue Judo Gis are optional and can only be worn on the Blue Side

**PINK JUDO GIS WILL BE PERMITTED in the spirit of this event!** – If one or both players is wearing pink gi, then a blue and white belt must be worn as usual. **Pink crew-neck T-shirts will be accepted in lieu of standard white T-shirts!!!**

Competitors should bring their own Blue and White belts for this Competition.

All Adaptive/Special Needs Players competing in Special Needs Categories will follow **2018 Special Needs Judo Union Rules** – These rules will be reviewed during the Referee and Coaches Meeting. Any Special Needs Player who “Opts Out” of Special Needs category to compete in a typical category will follow the General Tournament Rules. Categories will be determined at the venue - based on special needs categories.

- Yonen Division: 2 ½ Minutes
- Adaptive/Special Needs Division: 2 ½ Minutes
- Shonen and Seinen Divisions: 3 Minutes
- Novice, Masters, and Mom’s Judo Divisions: 3 Minutes
- Brown and Black Belt Divisions (Except Masters): 4 Minutes

## Mom's Judo Division Rules:

The Adaptive and modified “Newaza” Division for the Fight for the Cure Tournament has become affectionately coined as “Mom's Judo.” This Division has been created to encourage our devoted moms to compete and help us “Fight for the Cure.” The goal of this particular division is friendly and safe competition for very new players, or those who may be unable to participate in a typical judo match due to physical limitations. The primary difference with this division and the Special Needs/Adaptive “Newaza” Division is that Mom's Judo **WILL ALLOW** “around the neck” techniques such as traditional Kesa Gatame or Koshi Guruma grips. There is less concern for C1 and C2 vertebrae injuries with this division.

**The Mom's Division has been specifically created for our judo moms** – this is not for Yonen or Shonen. If you have questions regarding your qualifications to compete in this category, please contact the Tournament Director Brian Money at [Bmoney@riversideca.gov](mailto:Bmoney@riversideca.gov) or (951) 353-7118.

- Players will enter the mat as normal (standing) and then meet at the center of the mat with the referee. Each competitor will go into “Seiza” for a kneeling bow to each other.
- The referee will wait for the players to position themselves, one knee up - facing each other. Players will be within arm's reach of each other when Hajime is called. **Match time will be 3 minutes.**
- Upon Hajime, players will begin Newaza for Osaikomi (pins). A deliberate lateral takedown by tori (attacker) that results in uke landing largely on their side or back will be scored as a Waza-ari (1/2 point). The players may continue in Newaza. **Armbars and chokes are not permitted in this division.**
- **Lateral takedowns can only be scored as a Waza-ari** (no Ippon) and Osaikomi for Ippon or Awasate Ippon will determine the winner of the match. If no score is awarded by the end of the match, then Hantei will be awarded.
- Armbar, chokes, Sutemi-waza (sacrifice techniques), and Tachiwaza (standing techniques) are not permitted in this division. Players must remain in Newaza during the entire match - **no standing.**
- **Pushing a player straight backwards (instead of a lateral takedown) is NOT PERMITTED.** Mate will be called if a player is pushed backwards instead of to either side. Pulling a player forward is permitted – leg grabs are permitted (however, not inside the sleeve or pants opening at the ankle).
- Any attempt at a Choke or Armbar will immediately be stopped by a call of “Mate.” First warning will be a Shido. Any subsequent attempt will be Hansokumake for the player in violation.
- If a player attempts to stand during the match, then Shido will be called against her. Three Shidos will result in Hansokumake.
- At the end of the match, players will stand facing each other and wait for the Referee to recognize the winner. Players will bow to each other if they choose, then exit the competition area.

## **Starting Positions**

In **Tachiwaza**, there are two possible starting positions:

- In the usual way, according to the IJF Tournament Regulations;
- In the case where one or both of the judoka has a visual impairment or is blind, or has a disability that impairs the execution of a correct kumi-kata, the judoka will bow at about four meters of distance. The attendant, coach or referee is allowed to support the judoka. At the command of the referee, the judoka approach mat center and perform basic kumi-kata (sleeve, lapel). They will not change position from that moment until the referee announces "Hajime."

In **Newaza**, starting position can be different depending on the following procedure:

- The judoka enter the contest area, where necessary supported by attendant, coach or referee. The judoka bow at about two meters of distance, after which referee announces Hajime. If either judoka has a visual impairment or is blind, the match starts in basic Kumi-kata (Sleeve-Lapel)
- If either judoka cannot use one leg for support, this is also not allowed for the opponent. The referee will agree this before the match with the table jury.
- If either judoka cannot perform the match in kneeling position, the judoka will start the match in a sitting position. In this case, the opponents sit next to each other, facing opposite directions, and kumi-kata is basic sleeve-lapel.
- If either judoka cannot perform in a sitting position, both judoka will start lying down, facing each other, in basic Kumi-kata (sleeve-lapel). 7 SNJU Rules and Regulations

## **Newaza Contest**

- Newaza matches are performed exclusively in Newaza posture because either judoka, because of a disability, cannot perform safely in Tachiwaza.
- When applying for a tournament, the intention to perform in Newaza must be clearly stated.
- A referee is authorized to change a Tach-waza match into a Newaza match. The judoka that triggered this decision will then perform in Newaza for the remainder of the tournament.
- Tilting techniques leading to Uke landing on his/her back will gain a score according to the IJF Tournament Regulations. Uke does not have to leave the mat surface for this.
- Uke cannot score from Osae-komi.

## **Prohibited Actions**

In addition to the prohibited actions as described in the IJF official Judo rules, the following techniques are also prohibited:

- Any and all forms of:
  - a. Sacrifice techniques (sutemi-waza) including Tani Otoshi and Makikomi
  - b. Arm-lock techniques (kansetsu-waza)

c. Choking techniques (shime-waza)

d. Choking, locking and holding techniques that involve holding the legs in a triangle position (sankaku-waza)

e. All throws executed on one or two knees (to the front and rear).

- Allowing yourself to fall on the opponent after a properly executed technique.
- To put pressure on head, neck or throat of the opponent.

**In Tachiwaza:**

a. To perform Kumi-kata around the head or neck of the opponent. While taking hold over the shoulder or collarbone, the hand may not pass the center line of the back.

**In Newaza:**

a. In Newaza, it is not allowed to put pressure on either head or neck. In Osaekomi situations where Tori is in Kesa Gatame position, Tori is not allowed to put either hand or arm under head or neck of Uke.

b. Pushing opponent backwards while in kneeling position is not allowed.

c. To immediately release kumi-kata after Hajime during matches with a modified starting position.

d. In Newaza matches: Raising the knee to gain leverage when it is agreed beforehand that this is not allowed.

**Prohibited techniques will not be scored, and where possible mate will be called before the technique is executed to ensure the safety of the players.**

## Penalties

- The techniques mentioned in section 6 plus leg grabbing will be penalized with Shido.
- All actions that go against the spirit of Judo or the safety of either judoka will be penalized with Hansoku-make, to protect the judoka affected by this. The referee is allowed to consider the level, the disability, type and intention of the offense in his decision, as well as the intention, repetition, overall match image and safety while deciding on a penalty

## Judo Gi and Aids

- Aids are considered all attributes outside the standard Judo uniform as described in the Tournament Regulations.
- The Judo Gi must be adjusted to the physical limitations of the judoka however must not be a hindrance for the opponent to perform Kumi-kata.
- Wearing socks and a plain white or pink t-shirt under the Judo Gi is allowed.
- Wearing a mouth guard is allowed.
- Aids must be safe for the wearer and the opponent, and cannot contain hard substances or surfaces, to be decided at the discretion of the main referee.
- Opponent may not be disadvantaged, nor may the wearer have an unreasonable advantage from the aid. Glasses cannot have hard surfaces and must fit flush to the face
